- ▼ Wish to standardize

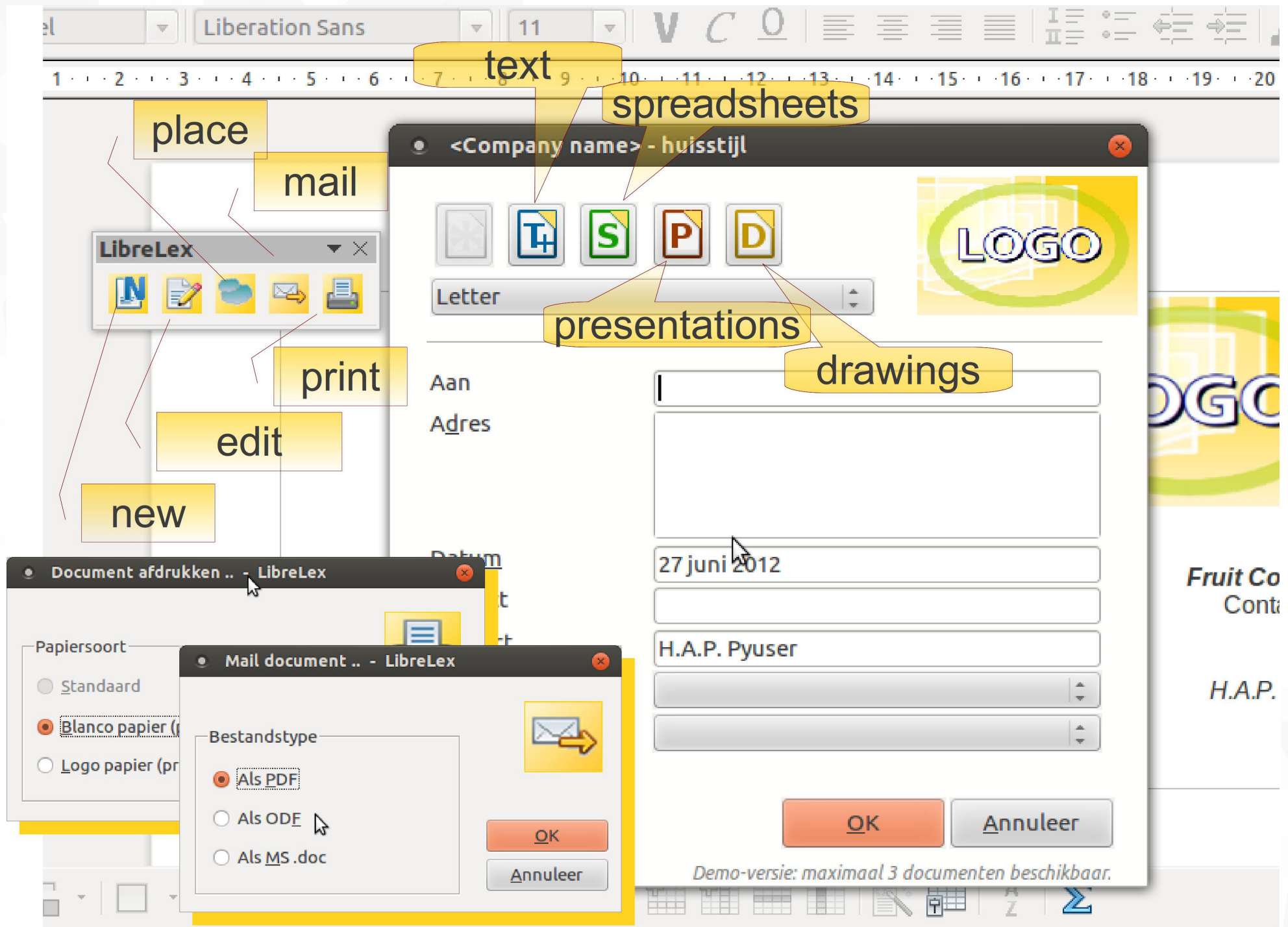


Various views

 - ▼ e.g. new fields, default values
- ▼ Extending
 - ▼ new documents
- ▼ Configuring
 - ▼ default paths, naming

Coder/Community opportunities

- ▼ Macro-code – makes use of existing API
- ▼ Open source (TBD)
- ▼ More translations
- ▼ Probably interesting extension
